Auckland's economic development and poverty need the greatest attention

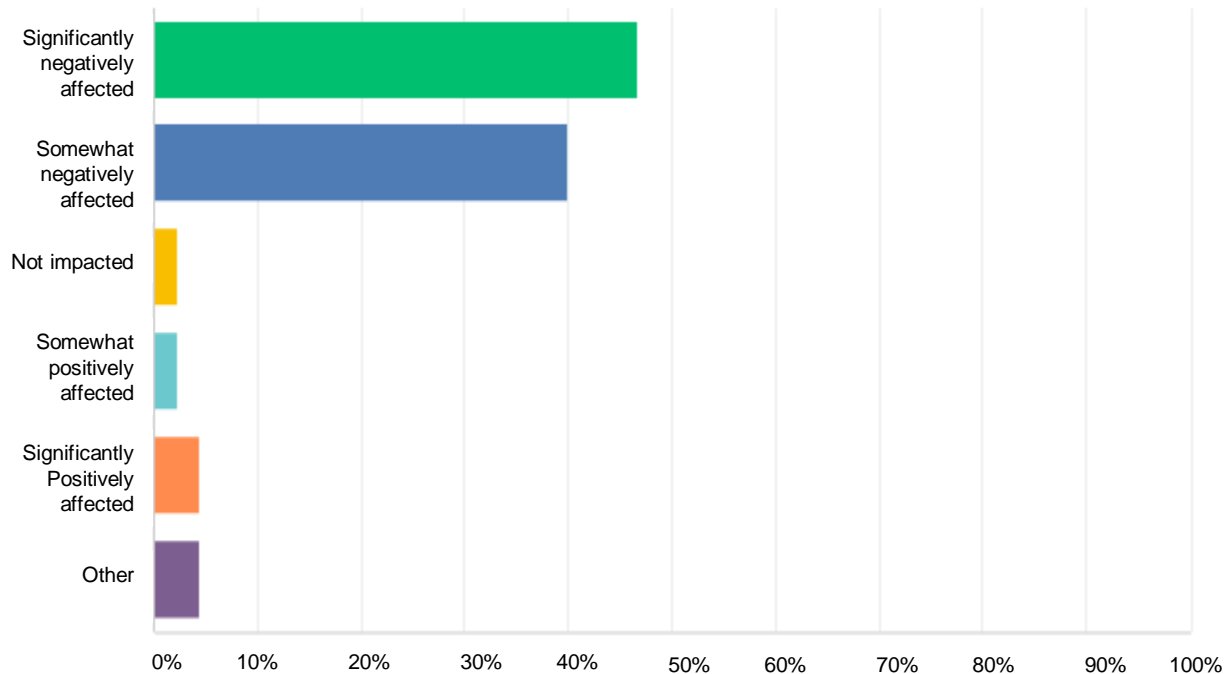
Covid-19 presents Auckland's leaders with much greater opportunities, than adversities

Adapting to work with Covid-19 together with new priority projects should be Auckland's top focus

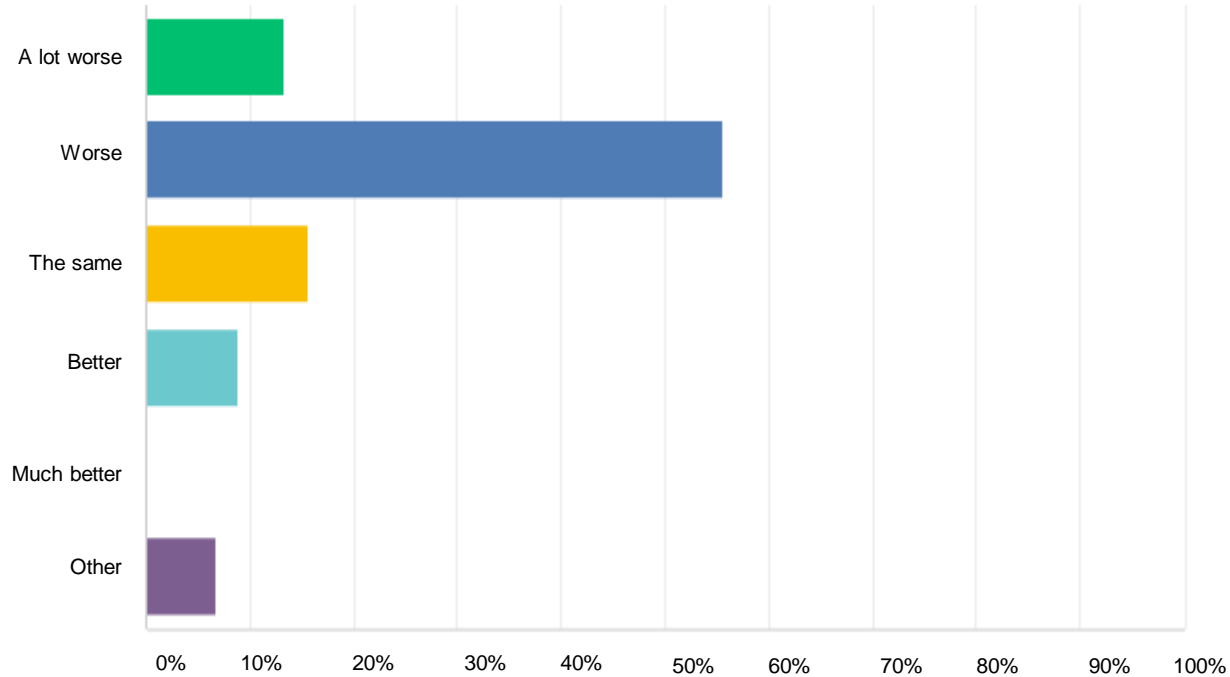
Auckland Council should update or transform its existing project priorities to reflect Covid-19 impact

Auckland Council will make less progress unless it adapts

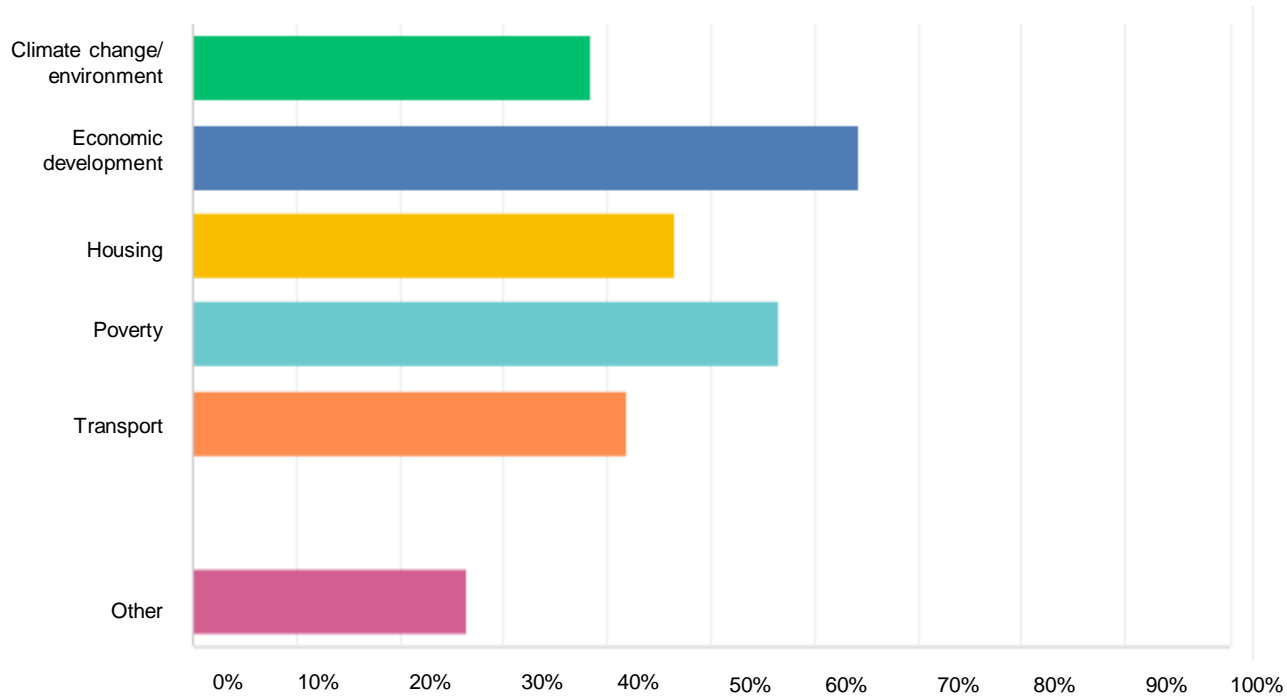
87% of organisations have been negatively impacted by Covid-19 - almost 50% significantly



Business prospects over the year to 31 May 2021 are worse or a lot worse for 69%



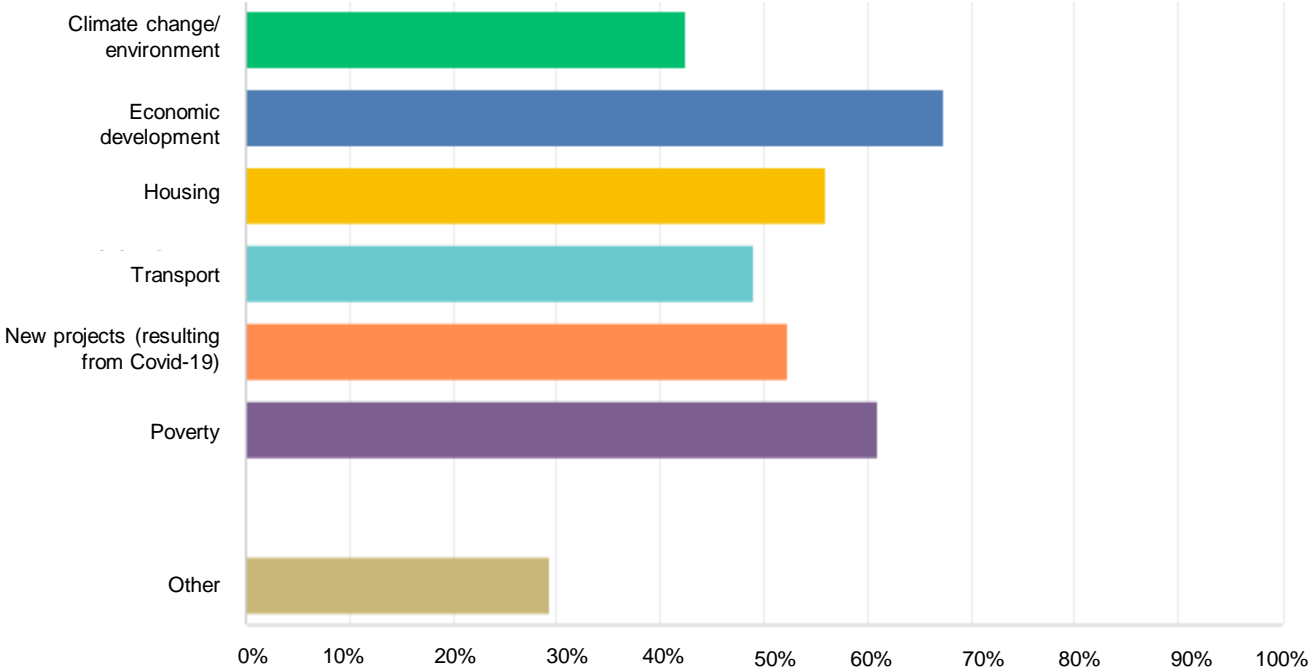
Economic development and poverty have been most negatively impacted by Covid-19

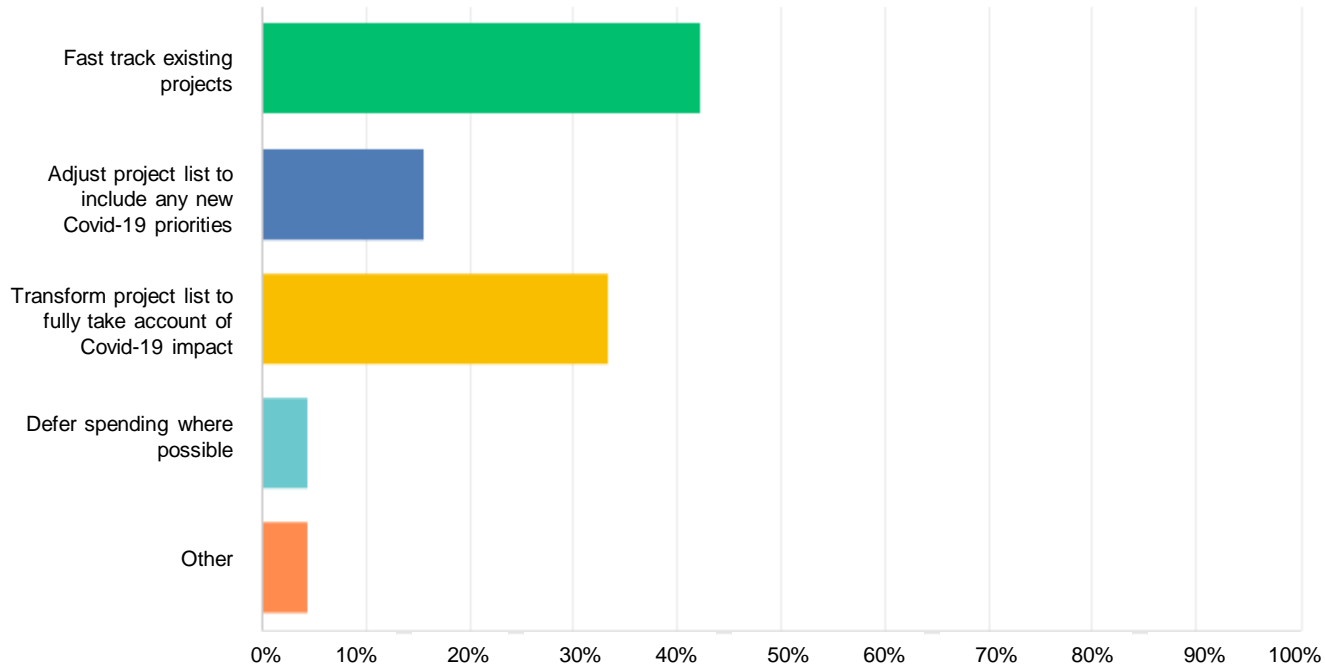
Economic development and poverty should receive greatest attention by government/council. Housing and new Covid-19 related projects follow.

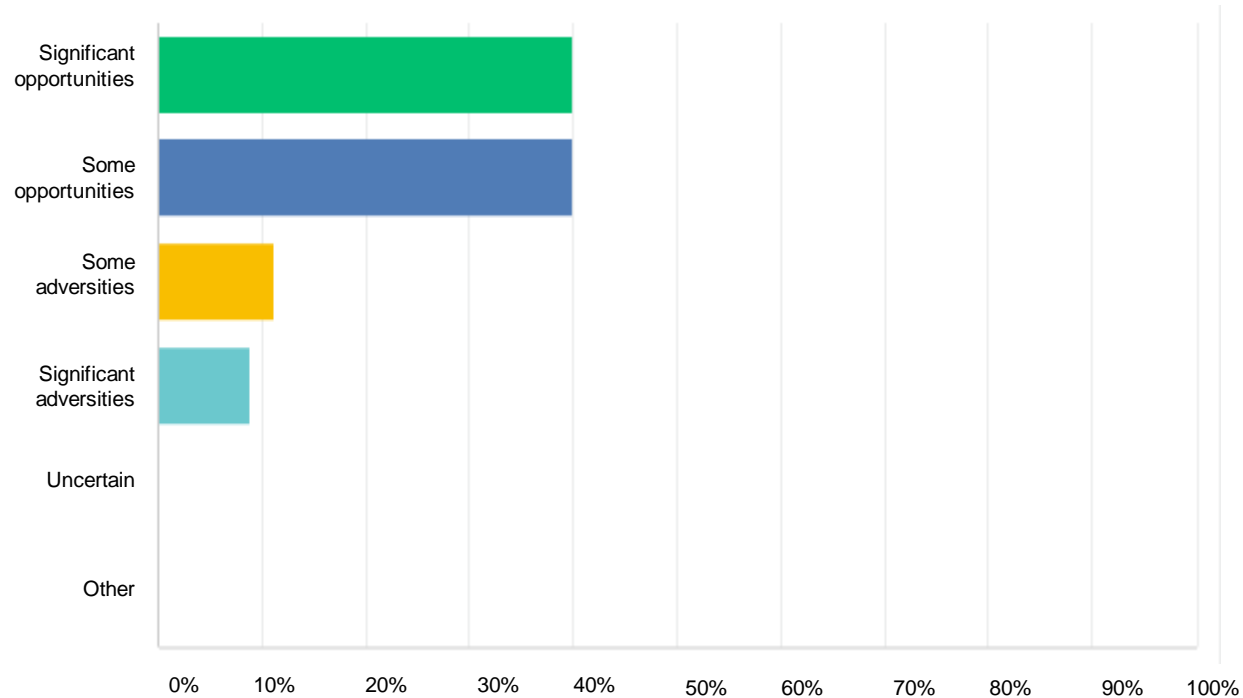
50% think Auckland Council should update/transform existing project list to reflect Covid-19.



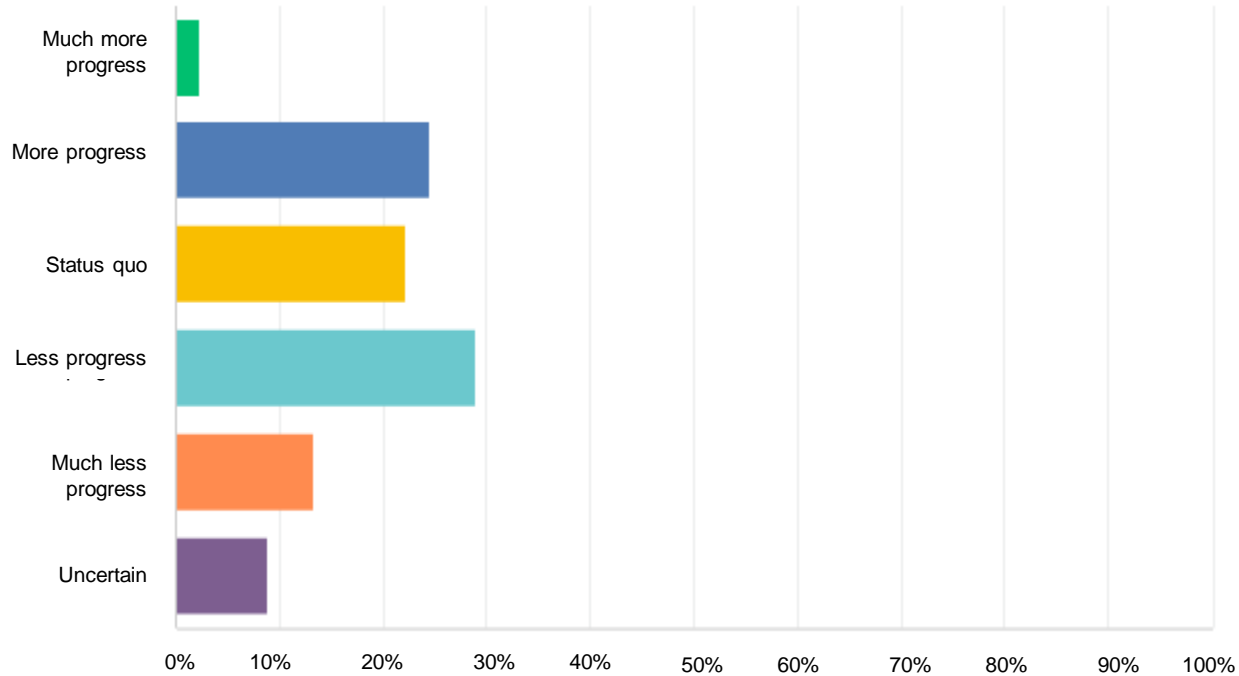

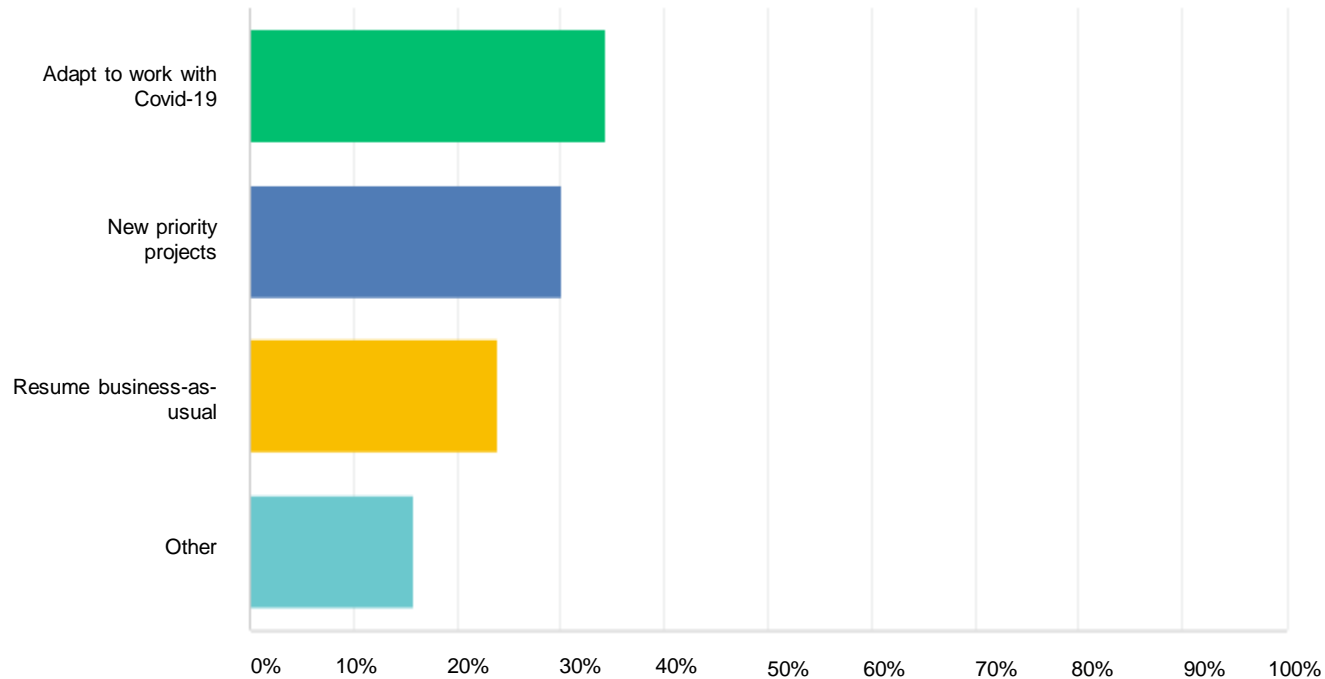
80% think Covid presents opportunities



42% think Auckland Council will make less progress over the coming year



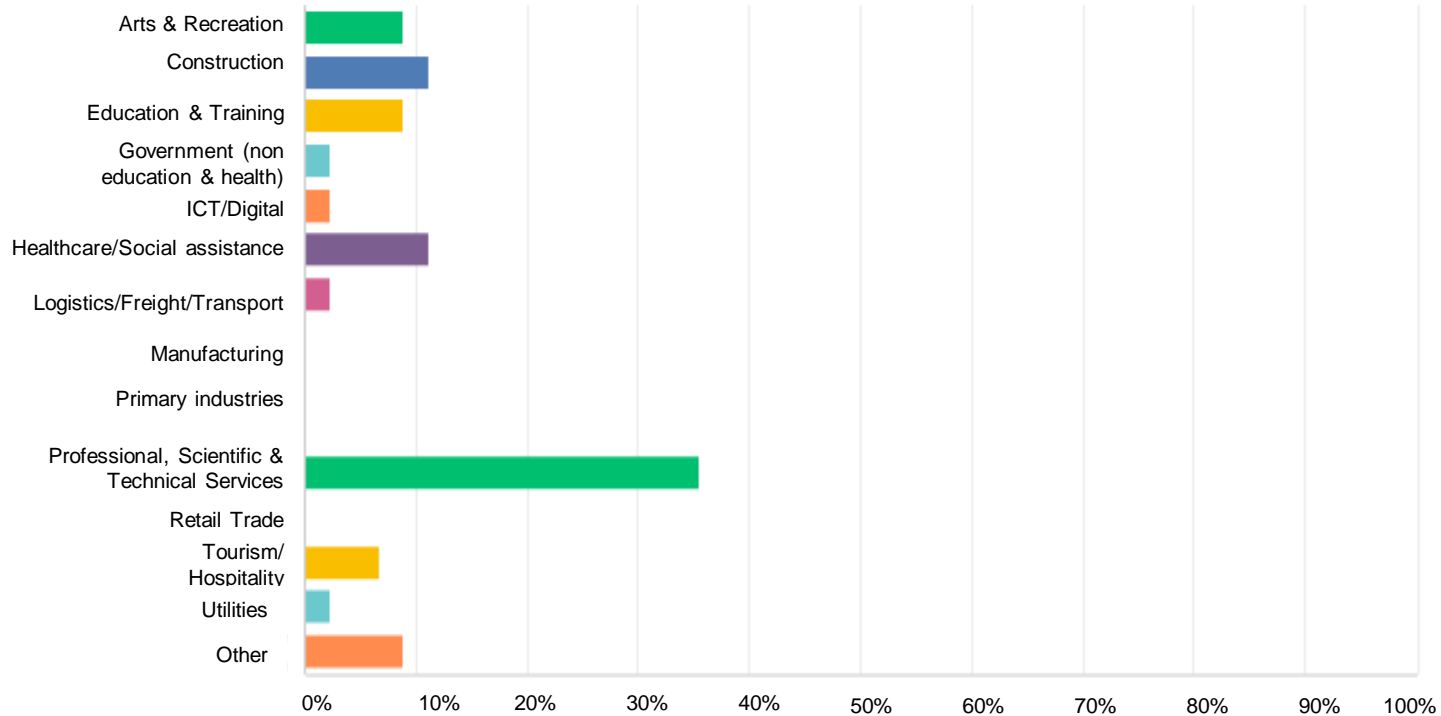
Adapting to work with Covid-19 should be Auckland's leaders' top focus now, closely followed by new projects



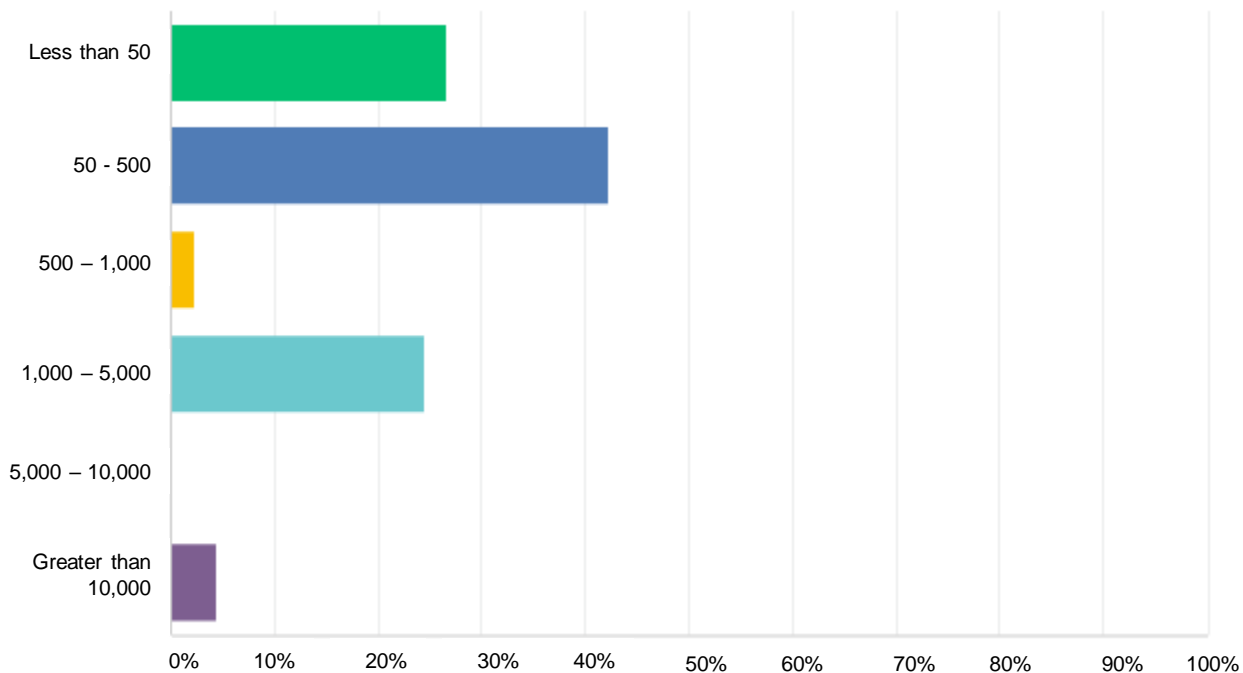
